

Swindon & District Directory Extract 1928 Tockenham



A PARISH in the Chippenham Division of Wilts, Union and Petty Sessional Division of Cricklade and Wootton Bassett, County Court District of Swindon, and Diocese of Salisbury, Tockenham is 3 miles from Wootton Bassett Station (G.W.R) and 8½ from Swindon. The register of the Church of St. Giles dates from the latter part of the 16th century. The list of the clergy goes back to 1313. Tockenham is mentioned in Domesday Book. The Church has a remarkable Roman figure, built into the south wall, of Aesculapius, which attracts considerable attention from archaeologists. The living is a rectory, of the net annual value of £250, with residence, in the gift of the Lord Chancellor. Area, 779 acres; rateable value £1.816; population, 146. Letters are received through Wootton Bassett morning and evening. There is a Post Office available for Postal Orders.
