Letters testimonial certifying that Stevens has done several great cures in Trowbridge, and requesting a license 'whereby he may use and practise the said arts of science of physic and chirurgery in any place within this kingdom without the lett, hindrance of molestation of any person', signed by the churchwardens, overseers and parishioners of Trowbridge, including William Frampton, licensed in physic and surgery, John Aisham, licensed in physic and surgery, Anthony Onely, licensed surgeon, Roger Frampton, licensed to practise surgery Joseph Weall, licensed to practise surgery, and Joseph Cray, mathematician, 16 Jan. 1708, annotated with fiat of Thomas Cooke, surrogate, 8 March 1708; endorsed with note of dioceses licensing; Bath and Wells, Salisbury, Bristol and Gloucester: VX 1A/10/429.
