Upton Lovell *1800-1849*

1826

The commission for holding the Assizes of the county of Wilts was opened at the Council Chamber of this city [Salisbury] on Saturday by Mr. Justice Burrough. The business commences this day, the above learned Judge presiding in the Crown Court, and Mr. Justice Gaselee at Nisi Prius. There are no less than 79 names of prisoners on the calendar for trial, viz. Benjamin Jefferies, for stealing 2 sacks of wheat from Richard Smith, of Upton Lovell. **Salisbury & Wiltshire Journal, 6 March 1826**

1848

Wilts Epiphany Sessions. Sentences of the prisoners:- Two months imprisonment - James Dyer, stealing onions at Upton Lovell. **Salisbury & Wiltshire Journal, 8 January 1848**

Committed to the County Gaol. Samuel Clifford, of Chippenham, and Luke Taylor, of Upton Lovell, charged with stealing a sheep, the property of Thomas Axford at Boyton: Taylor is also charged with stealing a sack, the property of John Andrew Ingram, at Upton Lovell - Also charged with stealing a sack, the property of Thomas Raxworthy, at Upton Lovell. **Salisbury & Wiltshire Journal, 8 July 1848**

1849

For Trial Robert Bennam, charged with stealing a quantity of potatoes and parsnips the property of Thomas Raxworthy, at Upton Lovell **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 27 December 1849**
