SALISBURY DIOCESAN BOARD OF EDUCATION

On consequence of the inability of the Bishop to attend through indisposition, the chair was taken at the quarterly meeting last Wednesday by the Dean of Salisbury. There were present, Mr Charles Raikes, Mr T. Hodges, Rev. Chancellor Eddrup, Rev. Precentor Lear, Rev. Prebendaries Renaud and Morrice, Revs. Austin Gourlay, James Fisher, E. Luard, J. F. Messenger, T. Carey, and the Secretary. A grant of 20 £. was made towards building a school at Farley, 10 l. towards a certified teacher at Broad Twon, grants of 5 £. and 4 £. to wards books at Dilton Marsh and Upton Lovell, 5 £. for desks at the former place, and 3 £. towards a night school at Chitterne. There was no other business of importance before the Board.
