Weather Station report from 1933. The card records the following information:

<b>Date of storm</b>	11th August 1933
<b>Station</b>	Rectory at Upton Lovell, Wiltshire
<b>Time first seen or heard</b>	11-12am, 2pm and 3pm BST
<b>Direction</b>	North West
<b>Type</b>	Thunder Alone
<b>Distance Away</b>	Estimated 5-10 miles
<b>Rain</b>	Very heavy, commenced at 2.50pm
<b>Observer</b>	Brian Walker
<b>Severity</b>	Thunder only not very loud
<b>Weather</b>	Heavy rain for short time following gentle rain
<b>Wind</b>	Light Northerly breeze
<b>Temperature</b>	No change during storm
