Assault - Edwin Elloway

Police Court, Saturday. - Before Lord Heytesbury and Captain Southey.

Edwin Elloway, of Warminster Common, was charged with assaulting **Stephen Curtis,** also of Warminster common, on the 21st inst. - Complainant said he was at the Globe Inn on the day in question, and while there defendant, without any provocation, knocked him down and beat him severely. - Defendant denied having struck the prosecutor without any provocation and said that the (complainant) offered to fight the best man in the room, and that they then both fought together. - The Bench dismissed the case, the Chairman remarking that defendant ought to be ashamed of himself to have struck an old man like Curtis.
