



## Burglaries in the Market Place

During the night of Friday last, some thieves effected an entrance through the dining-room window at the rear of the premises of the new Wilts and Dorset Bank, Market-place, occupied by the manager, Mr Munday. A quantity of silver and electroplate was deposited in the sideboard in the drawing-room. Amongst the plate were two valuable silver cups, won by Mr Munday at competitions amongst the members of the 10th Wilts Rifle Volunteers. Both cups were stolen, but no other articles are missing, and no other room appears to have been visited. The thieves then made for the residence of Mr Webb, upholsterer, &c., also in the market-place. Here they succeeded in gaining an entrance by forcing open the sitting room window at the back of the house, and although a good many articles of silver had been left in the room, strange to say, nothing is missing; but a boy's jacket was carried into the garden and thrown away. A chisel appears to have been used for forcing the windows at both places, and a ladder was taken from a garden for scaling the walls between Mr Munday's and Mr Webb's premises, and footprints of two persons are visible on the garden plots. The police are using every exertion to get hold of the thieves, and we hope their efforts will prove successful.
