Private Wallis Walter Prince

Private W. W. Prince, Service No: 9498; Date of Death: 26th September 1915, aged 22. 2nd Battalion Wiltshire Regiment.

Commemorated at Loos Memorial, Panel 102.

Son of William and Mary Prince, of 33, Brook Street., Warminster

Wallis Walter Prince was born in the Warminster Registration District and registered in the September Quarter of 1893

In the 1891 census his father William Prince was a Commercial Stores labourer.

In the 1901 census at Brook Street, Warminster, the family comprise: Mary Ann Prince, 48, Frank, 19, Annie Louisa, 15, Lilian, 11, Ernest Harold, 10, Walter Wallace, 8, Nora, 6, Ida, 3.

According to the 1911 census Walter had moved to Abercarn a small mining village near Newport in Monmouthshire. Wallace Walter Prince, 18, born in Warminster, is listed as brother in the household.

He is commemorated on the Warminster War Memorial.
