West Wellow



WEST WELLOW is a scattered village situated on the Salisbury and Southampton road, 4½ miles south-west from Romsey station on the London and South Western railway, and 12 south-east from Salisbury, in the Southern division of the county, Amesbury hundred, Salisbury and Amesbury petty sessional division, Romsey union and county court district, Romsey rural deanery, Winchester archdeaconry and diocese. East Wellow, in Hampshire, and West Wellow together constitute a parish, known as East Wellow. The church of St. Margaret is an old flint and stone building, chiefly in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave of four bays, south aisle, south porch and a square western wooden belfry containing 3 bells: it is situated in East Wellow: there are about 200 sittings. The register dates from the year 1570. The living is the vicarage of East Wellow, yearly value £245 5s. with residence and 26 acres of glebe, in the gift of William Shore Smith esq. and held since 1883 by the Rev. George Meyrick Jones M.A. Worcester College, Oxford. There are Wesleyan and Primitive Methodist chapels. There is a mission hall at Canada, which was enlarged in 1889; services held on Sunday evenings: it has 204 sittings. William Shore Smith esq. of Embley Park, East Wellow, Hants, is lord of the manor and the principal landowner. The soil is sand and loam; subsoil, sand and clay. The chief crops are wheat, barley and roots. The area is 1,397 acres ; rateable value, £1,882; the population in 1881 was 575.
