### **Funeral Of Mrs Ludlow**

On Tuesday the 12th instant the remains of the late Mrs Ludlow, of Heywood House, who died at Maristow, Devon, the seat of Sir Ralph Lopes, baronet, were interred in the family vault, in Westbury church. The arrangement was under the direction of Mr John Ingram, the undertaker, and was in the following order:-

2 mutes with silk bands, &c.

Clerk and Sexton with silk bands and cloaks

Upwards of 30 tenants on horseback, with silk bands and cloaks

Chariot containing clergy with silk bands and scarfs

Chariot containing medical attendants with silk bands and scarfs

Undertaker

Hearse containing the body, with plumes and feathers, drawn by 4 horses

10 Underbearers, with silk bands and cloaks, with their truncheons, 5 on either side

Mourning Coach, with principal Mourners, drawn by 4 horses

Page on each side

Mourning Coach with Mourners, drawn by four horses

Chariot and coach, containing Pall Bearers, with silk bands and scarfs

Carriage of deceased, drawn by 4 horses, with servants, crape bands, and cloaks

Carriage of Sir Ralph Lopes, with servants, crape bands and cloaks

Carriage of Robert Haynes, esq, servants with silk bands and cloaks

Carriage of T. H. H. Phipps, jun, esq, servants with silk bands and cloaks

Carriage of Mrs Whittaker, servants with silk bands and cloaks

Carriage of ----- Clerk, esq, servants with silk bands and cloaks

Carriage of Doctor Seagram, servants with silk bands and cloaks

Carriage of J. Gibbs, esq, servants with silk bands and cloaks

Carriage of E. Harrison, esq, servants with silk bands and cloaks &c. & c.

Thousands of persons were assembled to witness the mournful procession: the departed lady being held in such high estimation, that every inn and shop throughout the whole line of the procession (with the exception of one or two) were closed, and a more imposing ceremony has not been witnessed in Westbury, since the funeral of the late Abraham. Ludlow, esq, which took place in the year 1822.
