## Church Meeting

At the annual church meeting of All Saints Church, Whiteparish, held at the school, the Rev. B. C. D. Palmer (vicar) presided, supported by Mr. W. J. McKanan-Jones (secretary) and Miss Post (treasurer).

Sir Alfred Wort was re-elected Vicar's Warden, and Mr. H. Hammond People's Warden.

Reviewing the past year, the Vicar said the attendance at services had been much the same as the year before. He thanked all who had helped in the work of the church in the year.

The amount sent to Overseas Missions, he said, was £34 13s. 8d., £20 less than the year before. The circulation of the parish magazine continued to rise, and was now nearly 180 copies a month. There were 252 names on the Electoral Roll.

The balance sheet, presented by Miss Post, showed that they year opened with a balance in hand of £21 16s 5d. After heavy expenses, they now had a balance of £1 11s. 1½d.

Mrs Jepson reported on the Mothers' Union activities during the year.
