



Stamps issued for Posting Newspapers

From the Official returns, last published, of the number of Stamps issued to the Newspapers in Great Britain for the year 1865-66, it appears that the number issued to the Salisbury & Winchester Journal was 90,000, a number which far exceeds that of any other paper published in the South-Western Counties of England. Although that number represents a decrease of 16,000 on what we used five years ago, our total circulation is rapidly progressing, the decrease in stamps being due to the extension of railway communication in the district, and the establishment during the last few years of numerous agencies for the sale of unstamped papers.
