The Service Record of Private Alban West did not survive, was lost due to bombing in WWII, Ref WO 363.										
1913 Admission to National Union of Railwaymen, occupation, a Porter. Archive Ref MSS.127/NU/OR/2/27										
1914 Marriage to Sarah Cecelia Powell, aged 21, daughter of John Powell at Rowde										
Most of the 35 soldier who are commemorated at the Famars Cemetery died during the battle for Famars, which was captured by the 4th Gordon Highlanders on the 27th October 1918, after 2 days fighting.
