## *Winterbourne Earls*

**CAUGHT IN HIS OWN TRAP.** Richard Jeffreys, was charged with having laid wires for the purpose of entrapping game, on the property of Mr. Burnt, of Winterbourne. The Magistrate considered the case proved, and the defendant had been convicted for a similar offence in 1863, he was fined £1 and costs, or 14 days imprisonment. The fine was paid. **Salisbury Times & South Wilts Gazette, 25 July 1868**

**County Petty Sessions Charge of Assault** A labouring man named William Reeves, of Winterbourne, was summoned for assaulting William Judd, a tailor, living in the same place, at a cricket match there, but a witness for the complainant not being in attendance, the case was adjourned for a week. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday, 10 October 1868**
