Winterbourne Monkton

THIS village is in the Devizes Division of Wilts, Marlborough Petty Sessional Division and Union and County Court District, and Diocese of Salisbury, and is 7 miles from Marlborough, the nearest railway station. Wootton Bassett and Calne Stations are both 8 miles distant, and Swindon and Devizes 10 miles. The register of the Church of St. Mary Magdalen dates from 1656. The living, a vicarage annexed to Berwick Bassett, joint yearly value £320, is in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury. Letters arrive through Swindon. The nearest Money Order and telegraph Office is at Avebury. Area, 1,879 acres; rateable value, £1.525; population, 194. The Post Office opens as follows: 8 a.m. to 11.30 a.m., 3.30 p.m. to 6.30 p.m., weekdays; 5.15 p.m. Sundays for despatch.
