Winterslow 1800-1849

## 1805

On Wednesday John Sainsbury, late of Winterslow, carrier, was committed to Fisherton Gaol, for trial at our next Assizes, on suspicion of his having stolen a sheep skin, the property of Mr. B. Hayden, also of Winterslow. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 28 January 1805

# 1818

Committed to Devizes Bridewell Robert Bailey, to be kept to hard labour for one month, for disobeying the orders in husbandry of his master, Mr. Robert Cooper, of Winterslow. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 13 April 1818

#### 1827

Mark Collins, of Winterslow, Mark Matthews, of Wishford, James Beaumont, of Alderbury, and David Woodman, of Nettleton, for three months each, for offences against the game laws. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 1 January 1827

# 1833

Committed to the House of Correction, Devizes John Bell of Winterslow, for 3 months for breaches of game laws; Henry Clarke and George Bell, both of Winterslow for 2 months for breaches of game laws; Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 21 November 1833

### 1837

Committed to Fisherton Gaol Thomas Shears, charged with breaking open the dwelling-house of Thomas Yates, at Winterslow, and stealing therein divers articles.
