

Experienced Speaker

Major H. B. Trevor-Cox, Winterslow Farm and company director, is a popular and capable speaker for the Conservative cause in the Salisbury area, and a valuable worker. His past record is particularly distinguished, and he is a man who can speak from experience and knowledge.

Educated at Eton and in America, he was M.P. for the Stalybridge and Hyde Division of Cheshire from a by-election in 1937 until he lost his seat in the "demob" General Election of 1945. During that period he was parliamentary Private Secretary to three Ministries - Health and Economic Warfare among them. At the last General Election he was unsuccessful in contesting Birkenhead, a Socialist stronghold.

As a major in the Welsh Guards he served in France and was on the General Staff from 1940-1944. He studied economic and political conditions in Germany from 1927-28, in America from 1929-30, and Canada and the Near East in 1934.
