

## Post Office Directory Extract 1855

## Woodborough



**Woodborough**, a township, village and parish, in the Hundred of Swanborough, and Pewsey Union, 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> miles west of Pewsey, 9 miles east of Devizes, and 9 south-west from Marlborough.

At **Honey Street**, a short distance from the village, passes the Kennet and Avon canal, whereon is an extensive wharf for coal, timber, &c., of Mr. Samuel Robbins.

The living is a rectory, annual value about £500, in the diocese of Sarum; patron, G.H. Walker Heneage, M.P., who is lord of the manor. The Rev. William Thomas Wyld, M.A., is the incumbent. The church is an ancient structure, with a newly erected chancel.

The area of the parish is 967 acres, and the population, in 1851, 424.

Here is a Wesleyan chapel and National school.

Bottlesford is half a mile south.
