

STEALING FROM A SHOP AT WOOTTON RIVERS

Theodosia Brown, a married woman with a young child in her arms, was brought up under a warrant (she having failed to appear by summons to the last sessions at Everley), and charged with stealing a quantity of soap, spice, currants and tea, the property of Mr. Charles Goddard, carrier and shopkeeper of Wootton Rivers.

After hearing the evidence, the bench committed the prisoner for trial at the assizes.

LARCENY AT WOOTTON RIVERS

Theodosia Brown, 36, was indicted for stealing a quantity of spice, currants &c., the property of Charles Goddard, at Wootton Rivers, on the 23rd May. Mr. Goldney appeared for the prosecution. The prisoner was found guilty and sentenced to six months' imprisonment.
