

Letter from the Vicarage



I like the buzz in the air come December. Some people think Christmas begins too early and causes too much stress. That depends on how you take the hype. It is not compulsory to sink under everything happening around you. We recently went to a garden centre and avoided the Christmas grotto altogether — it wasn't difficult. The nodding Santas and flashing icicles I can do without, but I am looking forward to Christmas, partly because I like celebrating and sharing time with those close to me.

But as a Christian, primarily this is for me the celebration of Jesus birth and one of my main concerns is that we remember the reason for the season. The clue is in the name. Christ-mas means 'the festival of Christ'. Take Jesus Christ away and there is no Christmas - a winter festival perhaps, but not Christmas.

I am certainly not against adding bits and pieces to the Christian meaning of this season, as long as they do not detract from the person of Jesus. And there is the crucial point. Jesus can sometimes simply be forgotten in the busyness and rush. We don't mean to, but there is just so much going on.

I recently re-read a poem by a famous First World War army chaplain known as 'Woodbine Willie'. In it he suggests that Jesus' story is so well known today, familiarity has bred indifference. And that is true more at Christmas than any other time of year.

In the poem Woodbine Willie (whose grandson is a Vicar in Marlborough) ima-

gines Jesus coming today. 2000 years ago Jesus caused a violent reaction which left Him on a cross, but today we are 'more civilised' and simply pass Him by without another thought. The second verse of the poem goes:

When Jesus came to Birmingham, they simply passed Him by.

They would not hurt a hair of Him, they only let Him die;

For men had grown more tender, and they would not give Him pain,

They only just passed down the street, and left Him in the rain.

It is a reminder that, amidst all we do to prepare for Christmas, we MUST remember this is about Jesus. It's not that we deliberately exclude Him; we just forget it's His day. This year, try putting Jesus at the centre of your celebrations; make a crib, go to Church, say grace before Christmas dinner, read the Christmas story; do something to remember this is Jesus birthday, and so make it a really special Christmas.



What's happening on the farm!

With autumn very nearly behind us, the last of the cattle have been brought in. With such a mild autumn, there was plenty of grass for them to eat but as the rain had made the fields very wet, we thought better in than out!

As we have brought the cattle in, we have wormed every animal. This is because the wormer they were given at the beginning of grazing season ran out in October, thus them having exposure to lungworms and gutworms before housing. If we did not ensure they were wormed the cattle would suffer and no matter how much food we gave them they would not gain weight.

The maize harvest was successful. It was cut on the 6th of October with an average yield of 18 tonnes to the acre. The D value is 75% and a starch content of 382 grams per 1000 grams. My nutritionist tells me the cattle should do well this winter!!

In October Home Farm had its Red Tractor Farm Assurance Audit. The inspector comes once every 18 months to inspect the farm and all its paper work to make sure everything is in compliance with the body's rules and regulations. I can tell you all we passed with flying colours. No non-compliances at all.

Finally it's that time of year again. I would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. We have not had a white Christmas for years; the odds for a white Christmas currently stand at 7-1, maybe just maybe!

Christ Church PCC Meeting

The Parochial Church Council of Christ Church met on Tuesday 10 November and discussed the following:

- 1. The heavy repair expenditure referred to earlier is now likely to occur next year, and in subsequent years, and the latest financial forecast indicates a close to break-even position for this year, despite the postponement of the annual fundraising Village "Theme" supper.
- 2. Overall, as reported earlier to the PCC, repair expenditure to implement all of the recommendations of the church architect in his Quinquennial Report is likely to total £30,000 over the next 4 years. It is hoped that some of the fund-raising events being planned to mark the 175th anniversary of the dedication of Christ Church on 5 October 1841 (see below) will contribute at least some of the sums needed.
- 3. The 175th Anniversary of the church's dedication will be celebrated throughout the year, next year, with a programme of events some purely fun, some fundraising and some designed to reflect on and give thanks for the church's place in our community.
- 4. It was reported that Steve Dewar is planning an extension of his activities with a new group for the 11 to 14 age range. The continuation of his youth work beyond early 2017 is still dependent on being able to secure adequate funding. Steps have been taken to try to address this and it is hoped that other benefactors will come forward, to replace those who have so generously funded his work to date.
- 5. David drew attention to the Szopka competition advertised in November's Bridge. This initiative, based on a Polish custom, attempts to depict the Nativity in a local context. The competition will be judged at the Carol Service on Christmas Eve.
- 6. The collection from the Remembrance Day service will be split 50:50 between the Royal British Legion and SAAFA, this being the recommendation of some of those who attended.

Community Speedwatch (CSW) Update

I am pleased to inform you that an enforcement team has been established within Wiltshire Police which will target CSW sites affected by persistent speeders or suffering a rise in recorded speeds, based on data provided by the Speedwatch team.

As a general rule, the enforcement team don't plan to announce the visit to a CSW site but information about when, where and the number of offences will be made available after the event. If a CSW team are present at the time, then they will be supported by the enforcement team. They will also be deploying ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) as part of the initiative.

On Friday 30th October three teams of officers using unmarked cars were out visiting various sites for 4 hours, including Worton. In total that day, 10 tickets were issued, all in excess of 14 mph over the speed limit, and there were 61 cautions.

Each officer involved in the operation is available during the week as well as the weekend. I can see this initiative growing and becoming more successful using the intelligence gathered by the Community Speed Watch teams.

In a recent hour long session in Worton during "school leaving time", 413 cars were counted travelling through our village of which 42 were doing in excess of the 30mph speed limit. If we are to keep the number of vehicles driving through our village at a sensible speed, then we need more volunteers to join our Speedwatch team. If you can spare even just an hour now and then, our team could use some extra help. 

A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

Christmas is coming. It's the season of goodwill, and all that!

Except, as I write this, the mood is not exactly festive. The terrorist attacks in Paris have taken place and, for the time being, the f-word is fear, not fun. Dozens of families will have to get through the holiday season without their loved ones.

Such was the scale of the murderous outrage that I am sure it will still be in the front of our minds when you are reading this. Feelings of helplessness and impotence in the face of that malignancy may remain.

There are precedents to such events. 22 years ago the IRA exploded an enormous bomb in Bishopsgate destroying a part of London where my wife and I had both worked until only a few months before. Life in London carried on and now there is peace, more or less, in Northern Ireland.

In the 1970s the Baader Meinhoff group and the Red Army Faction conducted a series of terrorist attacks in West Germany. Remember them?

In 1913, the suffragettes exploded a bomb that partially destroyed Lloyd George's house, yet now we look rather kindly on Mrs Pankhurst.

No one now has even heard of the Sheffield Outrages, a series of explosions and murders by a small group of trade unionist militants carried out in the 1860s. They had a just cause in objecting to conditions in the steel industry but took their actions a little too far.

None of this makes the current situation any happier but I hope history allows us to put current events into context. The wartime message resonates now: Keep Calm and Carry on.

Playground Review

We would like to conduct a review of the provision of playing fields in Worton.

Currently we have two large fields, one at Sandleaze, one at Whatley's. Sandleaze has more play equipment but there is still quite a lot of green space. Whatley's has less equipment; we had to remove the swings last year because of damage to the uprights and a big grass area. We are not sure how much the playing areas are used, certainly there is little concerted wear on the grass surfaces. Sandleaze can get very wet during the winter and then is almost unusable. We did consider moving the play equipment to a drier part of the area but the cost of this is prohibitive.

The Parish Council spends about £1,800 a year on grass cutting and hedge maintenance. We also have to pay for a yearly risk assessment and make weekly assessments of the areas ourselves. The play equipment is expensive to repair if this is necessary and very expensive to replace. We would struggle to replace any of the play equipment from current funding and would have to raise money or apply for grants to do so.

The Parish Council would like to carry out a review of this provision. Do we want or need to continue to maintain two areas, should we provide more equipment, should we put greater efforts into encouraging use of the play areas, especially the green areas? In the longer term, the two areas at either ends of the village seem attractive to people coming into the village but can we manage in the shorter term? Or indeed do we need to consider other alternative uses of these areas that will bring other benefits to the village and mean less impact on council funding?

We would like your opinions of the playground provision please. Do you, your children or grandchildren use these areas, how often, are they enjoyed or are they problematic? How could we improve them, how could we increase use or access?

In the New Year we will review all responses and see how we can take this forward. It may be that the next step will be a more formal meeting or perhaps a more detailed survey regarding use.
