


Letter from the Vicarage



"I just want to get back to work" said a young lady I was talking to today. "It's nothing to do with money; I just want things to get back to normal". This person has been unwell for a long time, and her illness means that life has been put on hold. "I suppose", she said, "I've almost given up hope".

Hope is one of the things the Christian faith majors in. The word occurs many times in the Bible, and it is something desperately needed in the world today.

What are the characteristics of Christian hope?

First, this hope is based on a person, Jesus Christ. Because Jesus died and has risen, his followers have a guaranteed hope. If you are going to hope, it is as well to know your hope is built on a solid foundation, and this is the best.

Second, this is a hope which goes beyond this life. To live as a disciple of Jesus is the best way to live life here and now, but our hope is also for eternity. St Paul once said: 'If it is for this life only we have hope, we are of all people most to be pitied'. But the truth is, Jesus has defeated death and so we have a sure hope of eternal life.

I have been asked several times recently about eternal life: what will heaven be like? Will a person sick on earth be healed in heaven? Generally our ideas of heaven seem to be that it will be somehow like here, but not quite so 'real', perhaps a bit insubstantial or airy. I think that is totally wrong. As usual, C.S. Lewis has some brilliant insights. He says that 'to enter heaven is to become more human than you ever succeeded in being

on earth.' The Christian hope is to be in the presence of God, who **is** love. On earth every act of love is tainted in some way because we cannot help a bit of selfishness getting in. In heaven we will know what true love is, for the very first time. Heaven is actually reality, and when we get there we will realise that this earth was only a pale shadow.

Third, this hope is a gift of God the Father given to all who trust Jesus as their Saviour and live their lives with him as Lord. It comes from God's grace, something given us though we can never deserve it. If your desire is to follow Jesus then this gift is yours, something you can rely upon totally. You will fail to be what you should be, but an awareness of your failings and a determination to grow closer to Jesus will bring forgiveness and a new start.

There are many things that can cause us to lose hope. Illness is one; others are bereavement or relationship breakdown or unemployment or despair. It is precisely then, of course, we need hope most. At those moments it is vital we return to the centre of our faith. Jesus loves us and he promises never to leave us. Whatever the outward situation may be, faith is taking him at his word and trusting him for now and for the future. Things may get tough, but He will prove to be faithful, I guarantee it!


As expected with so many things changing we are needed more than ever. So we are looking for people to join us as a

VILLAGE HALL MAINTENANCE

Eight people turned out on Saturday June 7th for the third Village Hall maintenance morning and although the weather was changeable we managed to achieve quite a bit. Hopefully some of you will have noticed that the railings have now been sanded and painted and the fire door has had its top coat. We also prepared some of the outside window sills ready for top coating next time, and built a compost bin (out of the old front door).

Inside we painted the window sills and sorted the draught that came from the badly fitted fire door and continued with cleaning. But, the most noticeable change is that we have made a start to the lobby by removing the interior wooden structure that held some coat hooks. This is in preparation for work which the Trustees hope to commission for August on re-skimming the floor in the lobby. As a temporary measure, for those of you using the Hall, there is an adjustable pole with coat hangers replacing the coat hooks.

Maintenance mornings are fun and we always leave with a feeling of satisfaction. Why don't you come along to the next one and see for yourself? The next maintenance day will be on Saturday July 19th.

Marston Parish meeting - 27th May 2014

Philip Salaman chaired the meeting attended by 16 parishioners.

Matters discussed were:

- Regarding ownership of the piece of land at Norney Bridge, Dave Handsford
 is investigating historical use of the land. Until such time as this matter is resolved it was agreed to fund the purchase of a new seat. A grant has been applied for.
- ii. Chris Cash was thanked for the work keeping it tidy thus far.
- iii. ROW 10 needs some attention before the contractors return to see if repairs are needed. A work party will be organised asap.
- iv. Chrissy Salaman has volunteered to organise lettings of the village marquee.
- v. Marston Ladies Group are disbanding and are thanked for all their hard work over many years. They have asked that surplus funds should be passed to the Parish Council and used for the benefit of all parishioners.
- vi. It was agreed to get quotes for keeping the Green cut.
- vii. Marston Parish Council has submitted their response to the application for a Solar Farm at Lower End Farm, based on the results of the village consultation.

Marston Parish Council Meeting - 27th May 2014

Present: Philip Salaman (Chairman), William Warden, Cathy Kavanagh, 'Cille Packer.

The following items were discussed:

- i. Mr Salaman discussed the issue of dispensation for conflicts of interest. It was pointed out that with such a small community there are likely to be occasions when the Council would be inquorate.
- ii. The ROW survey has now been completed and one landowner has been asked to remove an obstruction blocking a path over his land. A Path Improvement Grant has been applied for to place kissing gates on the path linking Plough Lane with Close Lane and permission is being sought from the landowners.
- iii. A new door has been ordered to repair the Phone Box with funds from the Insurers
- iv. Robin Shercliff has compiled a record of all local people killed in the war. A sum of £250 was agreed to support this effort.
- v. The Annual Finance return was agreed and signed off. The insurance renewal was agreed.

Proposed date for the next meeting 29th July 2014 commencing at 7.30pm in Marston Chapel.

Frederick Kempster, the Worton Giant

Frederick John Kempster was born in 1889 in Bayswater, London being the youngest of five children to George and Florence Kempster. His parents were of normal height and Fred was the smallest member of the family as a child, but when he started to grow, he soon outpaced the rest and by the age of 20 he was 7 feet 8 inches tall and weighed 22 stone. Fred used to visit his sister Ruth in Bath, where he was known as the Weston Giant. He used to visit the annual Lansdown Fair where he was part of a side-show act.

Frederick came to Worton in 1911 when he was travelling around Wiltshire with a French circus. It probably stopped for a few days in Devizes and Fred decided to stay on, living in The Lodge with his sister and brother-in-law. Although The Grange, next door, was probably the largest house in Worton, Fred, the tallest man, had to live in one of the smallest. It is said that he had to enter on his hands and knees and had to have a special bed made by Mr Hunt, the village blacksmith. Fred used to light his cigarettes from the paraffin lamps in The Rose and Crown where he also played darts while kneeling. He used to walk from Worton to Melksham and Devizes where he was able to light his cigarettes from the gas street lamps. Nellie Thomas can also remember there being a mark on the screen between the class rooms in the old school showing Fred's height, which by now was 8 feet 4 inches and his boots were size 22.

In 1916 he moved from Worton to the Barge Inn at Seend Cleeve where his sister had taken over the canal side public house. Fred also toured Germany, where he was billed as Frederick the Great, the English Giant. He was in Germany when World War 1 broke out and was kept for a while in an internment camp and then in a hospital when he became ill until he was released home.

He later toured the North of England as a fairground attraction but whilst in Blackburn Fred was taken ill with pneumonia and died aged 29 years on 15th April 1918. If he could have had only one wish, it would surely have been to be of normal size. At his funeral in Blackburn cemetery the solid oak coffin which measured 9 feet long was carried by 10 brothers as pall bearers.



Unfortunately the Annual Fun/Presentation was cancelled in June due to unpredictable weather conditions, and is now re-arranged for Saturday 5th July (please check website for info).

On the International stage, the Under 13s played in the Saint Marcel International Tournament 2014 (France), being invited as representatives of West Lavington, whose twinning town St Pierre D'Autils is next to Saint Marcel. This is the second time that a team from Wiltshire has participated. The team raised all their own funds to travel and participate and the players were hosted by the twinned town association members.

The tournament, won by Wolverhampton Wanderers in 2011, had teams invited from England, Germany and Morocco, as well as top teams from the Normandy/ Parisian area of France. With quite a high standard of play expected from the 20 teams participating, the matches were 20 minutes in length and were 8-a-side, so not something our team was used to.

Day 2 saw the quarter final against Wolverhampton, a battle of the English teams. It was a very close match which turned on a dubious penalty decision when their French U16 international fell in the box. The final score was 2-0 which perhaps flattered Wolves

This meant the team fell into a play off for 5^{th} to 8^{th} positions. Their next match was a 4-0 win against FC Yvelines, which meant they then went into a play-off for 5^{th} or 6^{th}

Unfortunately this game was to be played after a few hours, which in temperatures of 27 degrees, meant the boys were pretty tired by the time the match came around and didn't really perform to their ability going down 4-0 in the end.

Overall a very creditable 6th place out of 20. A measure of the success is that Wolves only finished 4th. Many friends made the trip over, with many new French experiences for the boys: from culinary delights of snails, to the interaction with French families and players.

WORTON PARISH COUNCIL

Annual Parish Meeting - We had a very successful Annual Parish Meeting which was very well attended. We have adopted a new format and held the meeting in the Village hall where we gave a summary of the Parish Council's achievements over the last municipal year and discussed ideas and plans for the forthcoming year. Last year, we placed benches in the village and plan another two so that there will be a circular walk around the village with regular sitting areas for rest and relaxation; there are new parish notice boards, bus markings outside the school, financial support for the village hall, and regular speed watch sessions to deter speeding vehicles to name but a few. A key issue for the Parish Council is road safety and proposed improvements were displayed for discussion.

Road Safety Improvements - The Parish Council negotiated road safety improvements with Wiltshire Council which include 'SLOW' patches and sign replacement at the north end bends, a formalised school coach stop opposite Sandleaze and an informal crossing point in the High Street near Cedar Close. The Parish Council has consulted with Parishioners in the immediate vicinity of these improvements which have received unanimous support. We now await dates for work to commence but hope it will be in the school holidays. We are also awaiting news of the revisions to the speed limit zone requested by Worton Parish Council, and as soon as we have the results we shall share them with you.

Defibrillator - Worton Parish Council has received a generous grant by Aster Communities to enable the village to have its own defibrillator. Keith and Margaret Green, landlords of the Rose and Crown, have kindly agreed for the defibrillator cabinet to be installed outside the pub. Once the cabinet has been installed we will be arranging familiarisation sessions for anyone that wants to attend, but no training is required for anyone to use this essential life saving device as thanks to the wonders of modern technology it will talk you through each step.

Public Benches - Two further public benches, funded by another generous grant from Aster Communities, will be installed at Cuckold Corner and at the junction of Cedar Close and the High Street. We hope you will enjoy the respite they provide, particularly if you are exercising as part of recuperation.

Worton and Marston Bridleway - We are going to undertake some pilot work to see how best to repair and maintain the bridleway from the Church to the bridge. If you have any ideas please come and share them with us at the next Council meeting.

Worton Festival - For next year we would also like to hear if there is support for a 'Worton festival', bringing together a number of planned and regular events into one season of co-ordinated 'festival' activity. Again, please come along and share your views at the next Parish Council meeting.

WW1 Remembrance - Worton and Marston Parish Councils have both given grants to support an innovative project to remember our WW1 fallen. This innovative project is led by Robin Shercliff and Worton Parish Council has undertaken to support his endeavours to include missing names on a war memorial. Worton Parish Council will also be considering a number of public events over the next four years, stretching right through the commemorative period.

Come and Join In - Worton Parish Councillors would like to invite all parishioners to join us and share their views. We welcome you on Monday, 7th July at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.





Typically, this will take 2-3 days per month and visit timings may be flexible depending on the Board's needs and those of the individual, although some of the input may be needed during normal working hours. The work is unpaid and expenses will be covered. While there is no minimum length of time for a Board Member to serve, the maximum length of service on an IMB is 15 years.
