

Letter from the Vicarage



A Picasso has just been sold for £102 million, a new record for a painting. Has it been bought because the buyer likes it or as an investment? No-one seems sure. Ten years ago when £50 million was paid for a painting everyone thought the market had peaked. It raises the question: 'what is truly valuable?' Here is a lovely parable I heard on the radio.

There was an art collector who had a very valuable collection of masterpieces. But he was a sad man. He had never got over the fact that his only son, a soldier, was killed rescuing a comrade. The last image he had of this son was a simple sketch, drawn by the soldier whose life his son had saved. It was not great art, but meant a huge amount to the man.

The man died and his art collection was put up for sale. Rich people came from all over the world hoping to buy a painting. The first lot at the auction was the sketch of his son. The connoisseurs mocked the sketch, it was not real art, they said. No-one was willing to bid. 'Who will take the son?' the auctioneer asked. Eventually the man's gardener bid £10 for the sketch, a lot of money for him. No-one else bid, he bought the sketch and the auctioneer closed the sale. There was uproar. What about the other paintings the rich had come to buy? Then the auctioneer read from the dead man's It said that whoever bought the sketch of the son would also receive the art collection. The person who got the son got everything else as well. The man wanted his paintings to go to someone

who recognised where true value lay.

What do you make of the story? In Jesus' world people did not collect art, but today I think he would have told just such a parable. Jesus was concerned that people had a right perspective on life. He once told a story of a rich man who was so wrapped up in his wealth he forgot to think about God and other people and so eventually lost everything.

The world around tries to convince us that material things are all important and sadly I think some have fallen for the lie. I sometimes ask the question: 'what do you want most from life?' and many young people reply: 'to be rich' or 'to be famous'.

Sorry, wrong answer. If those things come along then fine, provided they do not turn our heads away from what is really important. And what is that?

Jesus said that real happiness comes from good relationships – first with Him and then with others. 'Love God and love your neighbour'. It is in keeping those commands we do God's will and find meaning and fulfilment in this world and the next. I hope the buyer of the Picasso knows that.



Neighbourhood Planning Timetable - Every Voice Counts

There are 253 town and parish councils within Wiltshire. The Wiltshire Council Annual Parish Report for 2015 indicates that of the 253 parish councils, only 30 are currently involved with Neighbourhood Plans with others showing interest, of which Worton is one. Wiltshire Council outlines a number of essential elements for successful neighbourhood planning of which two are:

- 1. It should involve the whole community at all stages
- 2. It should be supported by at least half of the community

During the last few months there has been growing support for a neighbourhood plan. Your Parish Council has responded with a realistic timetable to maximise community involvement in this decision process. There will be a public open session in **October 2015** to which the whole community will be invited. At this open session the results of the recent parish survey will be presented, together with an explanation of the Wiltshire Core Strategy, what a neighbourhood plan is, process and timescale, as well as alternative options available to the Parish. This session will canvas the views of the parish.

In **September 2015** there will be a volunteer meeting for those who would consider joining a Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group. The intention of the meeting is for potential volunteers to exchange experiences and lessons learnt from volunteers in other NP Steering Groups to gain a good understanding of the long-term commitment which will be needed.

A successful neighbourhood plan needs full community involvement. Worton Parish Council is committed to providing opportunity for all parishioners to participate in the future planning of the village. Thank you, Worton Parish Council.

VOLUNTEER EVENING Could You Contribute to a Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group?

Worton Parish Council invites and welcomes all parishioners who would consider joining a neighbourhood plan steering group (NPSG) to a meeting in **September 2015** (date to be confirmed). A NPSG needs a wide range of skills as well as comprising a diverse mix of volunteers to represent the breadth of age, background, employment, interest and localities within the parish.

The intention of this meeting is for potential volunteers to meet existing volunteers in other parishes who are already engaged in the process of a Neighbourhood Plan. This will help volunteers understand the scope and long-term commitment which will be needed as well as sharing the benefit of others' experience and lessons learned. This will be an informal, relaxed evening with opportunity for open discussion and refreshments.



Christ Church Today

Christ Church is the Parish Church of Worton and Marston and a central part of the Community. It is used by regular worshippers, those who attend occasionally at times such as Easter, Harvest and Christmas, those who seldom come to church except for baptisms, weddings and funerals and sometimes by those who just need a quiet place to reflect.

The church is financed entirely by its congregation and regular givers but over recent years the number of people able to give in this way has decreased through people dying or moving away from the villages. This is of considerable concern to the viability of the church for the future.

We have now reached the position where the existing contributors can no longer support the cost of running the church. In addition, following a report by the church architect, essential work on the building has been identified which will cost in the region of £30,000 over the next five years.

WORTON AND MARSTON VILLAGE HALL REPORT

The Village Hall AGM took place on Tuesday April 21st when the following Trustees were elected:

Our sincere thanks go to Tony Walker, Frank Marshall and Teresa Chandler who stood down after several years of service each. Teresa will remain a member of our management committee representing the Ladies Group.

We still have one vacancy for a Trustee and would particularly like to have someone from Marston since the other Trustees all live in Worton. We are also looking for someone who can lead on involving the young people of our villages in using the Hall. This could be the same person or not. If you feel you could actively contribute to the running of the Village Hall please speak to either Veronica Franklin on 726845 or Jo Banks on 726658. We are a friendly bunch committed to ensuring the continuance of the Hall for both villages.

VILLAGE HALL MAINTENANCE -

The Village Hall maintenance group met regularly in 2014 and worked on improving the inner and outer foyers and the internal décor of the Hall. This spring the trustees have concentrated on submitting grant applications to improve the external fabric of the building. At the time of writing this we have not heard the outcome of these but they are expected soon so watch this space. We would like to say thank you to both Marston & Worton Parish Councils and to Mr Tim Weeding for their support which has been invaluable for the grant funding applications.

VILLAGE HALL HEALTH AND SAFETY

Following on from a fire safety check on the Hall, we have ordered a heat proof shield which, by the time of reading this, should have been installed to prevent the hob setting fire to the fridge if it should over-heat.

VILLAGE HALL 200 CLUB

The first draw of this year took place on April 29th. We left it as long as possible to encourage people to renew their subscription. To date 74 people have either joined for the first time or renewed their subscription. This is a far cry from the target of 200 but we are still hopeful that some of you who have not yet re-joined have simply forgotten to. Christ Church PCC Meeting

The Parochial Church Council of Christ Church met on Tuesday 28th April and discussed the following:

- 1. Attempts will be made to try to get better representation on the Family of Churches from denominations other than the Anglicans and Methodists (who make up almost the whole of it currently). In the meantime, the organisational aspects will be undertaken at Christ Church PCC meetings
- 2. There is growing concern about church finances, with planned giving by church members no longer covering outgoings. This is due to a drop in income, rather than increased expenditure, which continues to be rigidly controlled. It is likely that further appeals will need to be made to the congregations and also more widely.
- 3. The following officers were elected for the coming church year:

 Vice Chairman of PCC: Jean Lane
 Honorary Treasurer: Louise Hale

 Electoral Roll Officer: Peter Witcher

 PCC Secretary: Peter Witcher
- 4. The churchwardens confirmed that very substantial sums of money are likely to be required, over the next five years, to meet the cost of repairs recommended by the church architect. A programme of dealing with these in a phased manner is being worked on.
- 5. Much appreciation was expressed of all of the preparation for and subsequent celebration of Easter. This involves a lot of work by David and others, but results in very moving services for those who attend.
- 6. Preparations were discussed for the annual Holiday Club in the school summer holidays. More details will be announced later. In the meantime, a joint meeting with the PCC of St Mary's, Potterne will be held to discuss how the youth work currently undertaken under the auspices of Bath Youth for Christ can be continued, after the sponsorship of the current generous donors ceases.

WORTON PARISH COUNCIL (WPC)

Key Messages from WORTON PARISH COUNCIL (WPC) who met on Wednesday, 6th April at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall. (Agenda and Minutes of all meetings are on the Parish noticeboard located outside the Rose and Crown Pub.)

Village Survey - The response to the village survey has been overwhelming with almost 300 completed surveys. WPC would like to thank everyone who responded and look forward to sharing the results in due course. A quick assessment shows an interest in a youth council and support for affordable homes. The results will follow in The Bridge and on the Worton website, and will be on display at the WPC Open Session to consider Neighbourhood Planning in October.

Neighbourhood Planning - The Parish Council is preparing for an **Open Session in October** to facilitate all members of the community to consider options available to Worton and for parishioners to air their views on how we move forward.

In addition, there will be a **Volunteer Evening in September** (date to be announced). The intention of this meeting is for potential volunteers for a neighbourhood plan steering group to meet with volunteers from other parishes who are already involved with this process. This will be an informal evening and all are welcome. (see separate notice for more detail).

Worton Tree Regeneration - If you could accommodate at least one tree then please contact us - you will have a choice of tree to ensure it is suitable for the location and a protector and stake will be provided. All you have to do is plant it and admire it for many years to come!

Superfast Broadband - Superfast broadband is now available in Worton to all subscribers serviced through Cabinet 21 (near the post-box in the High Street) and to upgrade should contact their broadband service provider. Unfortunately, up to 40 houses (including the whole of Gaisford Chase) are linked to Cabinet 3 in Potterne which at present BT considers commercially uneconomic to upgrade to Superfast Broadband. WPC is pressing BT to transfer all Worton residents to Cabinet 21.

Parishioner Attendance - We are delighted to report that we have had a significant number of parishioners attending the last few meetings. All your Parish Councillors are volunteers who have made a commitment to give up their time each month to attend meetings and to consider matters affecting the village and wider surrounds. The next Council Meeting is on Monday 1st June at 7.30 in the Village Hall.

A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

Well, you've had your chance to participate in democracy. Whether or not you voted and whether or not the result was what you wanted, the die is cast and we have a government selected by the people in accordance with the rules of our system.

In the Devizes constituency, the turnout was over 71%, which is the highest since the election of 1992, nearly a quarter of a century ago. If a high participation rate is a good thing, then perhaps the health of our democracy is improving.

Another statistic of interest is that nearly 58% of the voters in the Devizes constituency supported the winning candidate, which is the highest proportion since 1935.

The democratic process, by definition, is competitive. In some ways it can also be confrontational but the same can be said of the legal process (criminally accused vs prosecutor, civil litigant vs defender) and to some degree, the planning process (applicant vs objectors). It is a reflection on civilisation if these contests are conducted without rancour. As far as I could tell, the interchange in this area between the protagonists in the General Election was almost unfailingly polite, which I think reflects well on our community and our society.

Having selected our representatives, we may, from time to time, need access to them so that they can deal with our personal issues. In the case of our MP, we can write or seek a personal meeting at one of the regular surgeries.

At county level, there are other opportunities to take an active part in the process of government. Full Council meetings, Cabinet meetings and most committee meetings are open to the public, who can usually speak if they wish. Locally, there is easy access to elected members (including me) through the Area Board, which meets every two months.

The next meeting of the Devizes Area Board is on Monday, 27th July. Doors open at 6.00pm and the proceeding start at 6.30pm and usually go on until 8.30pm. It's too soon for me to confirm the location or the agenda but there are normally a number of topics of interest. Details will be published on https://devizes.ourcommunitymatters.org.uk/ and on the Wiltshire Council website.





What's happening on the farm!

Spring is finally here! We have been able to let the majority of the cattle out but we are keeping in 65 or so young calves so that if there is any bad weather over the next two months they will not be affected by it. Because they are inside, however, they still require feeding and bedding up, extra jobs on top of the spring/summer work.

The maize was planted on the 24th April this year, a week later than last year, however I do not think it has made much difference. The soil was warm and moist when the seed was drilled. It is now up and growing at a rapid rate. When the seed was drilled we had fertiliser, called maize kicka, placed by the seed. In essence the fertiliser kick starts the maize seed and gives it essential nutrients right from day one, aiding establishment and growth.

We have started first cut silage making, with 35 acres cut on the 11th May with another 70 acres to do. However by the time you all read this I would hope that we will be finished, weather depending of course. I will be then praying for good weather in June so that we can make some quality hay.

With spring here, the farm is awash with wildlife and I am pleased to say that the English Partridges are still here on the farm. With their breeding season nearly upon us, I hope they will find somewhere with cover where they will successfully breed. I have been getting advice from a local game keeper on how to enhance parts of the farm so that wild game birds will successfully breed here.

On a final note with the cattle out in their fields please take care whilst walking the footpaths where there are cattle and please make sure you keep your dogs on leads. We do not want any accidents to happen.

Nux vom: sneezing fits, nose, eyes and face very irritated and hot. Itching extends to the larynx and trachea. Eyes light-sensitive. Irritated, impatient and snappy.


Lachesis: sneezing fits worse after sleep. Headache and dry stuffed sensation through the head, with red puffy face and sore nostrils and lips. The throat can also be sensitive, especially to pressure.

Homeopathy is a system of medicine which involves treating the individual with highly diluted substances, given mainly in tablet form, with the aim of triggering the body's natural system of healing.
