Letter from the Vicarage



You probably have favourite characters in books or TV series. They are the ones who keep you reading or watching, you want to know what becomes of them.

I have favourite characters in the Bible. One of them you may know as doubting Thomas, but I think that is unfair, I believe he gets a bad press. OK, he could not accept that Jesus had risen from the dead, but put yourself in his place. If your friends told you that someone you had seen die was alive again and had appeared to them, how would you react? And Thomas was the only one of the group missing when it happened.

A week later Thomas was given absolute proof that Jesus was indeed alive. He was invited to see and touch the wounds in Jesus resurrected body – how could he deny any longer? He was completely transformed

(Incidentally, here is a real problem for those who deny the resurrection; if Jesus was not raised, what **did** happen to those followers of his, transforming them from a crushed and broken group into a force that changed the world?)

According to reliable tradition, Thomas spent the rest of his life sharing the Good News about Jesus death and resurrection across the globe. He went to India and in 52 AD founded a church which still bears his name, the Mar Thoma church.

Thomas story teaches me a number of things:

First, doubt does not put anyone beyond the reach of God's love. The thing to do with doubt is to look at it honestly, acknowledge it to God and work through it. Jesus never dismissed anyone for doubting. Self satisfaction and self righteousness are certainly barriers to faith, but with doubt there is always a way back. Someone once wrote a book on doubt which they defined as 'faith in two minds'. I like that.

Second, no one should be judged by where they begin, but rather by where they end up. If we were to be remembered only for things we got wrong there would be no hope for us. Thomas was utterly mistaken at one point in his life, but that is not what we should remember him for. You may know someone who feels they are beyond God's forgiveness because of mistakes they have made. Will you tell them that God loves them as they are? He may want them to change certain things, but He is still there for them.

Third, Thomas shows me that faith has to result in action. Once he was convinced there was no stopping him! Travel from Palestine to India was no easy matter but now he is energised totally by his trust in the Lord who has called him, and nothing will stop him telling others what he knows to be true.

Doubting Thomas? Maybe, once, but what a lot he has to teach us all.

WORTON PARISH COUNCIL meeting minutes

11th April 2016, 7.30PM

Present: Councillors: R Wilshire (Chairman); Mr M Fisher; Mr W Francis;

Mr R Goss; Mr D Johnson; **Apologies:** Mrs S Bonfield

Also present: 1 member of the public, Cllr P Salaman [Marston PC]; Cllr R

Gamble; Mrs E Read (Clerk).

- **1. Apologies for absence -** Cllr Bonfield sent her apologies and these were accepted by the Council.
- **2. Declarations of interest -** There were no interests declared.
- **3.** The minutes of the last meeting of the Council Proposed by Bill Francis and seconded by Cllr Johnson to accept the minutes, this was carried and the minutes were signed.
- **4. Chairman's announcements -** Waste bin in Whatleys has a lock on it, which we do not have the key, and propose to remove.

Bus shelter has been sprayed with weedkiller, but will need to be done several times

NP terms of reference – at least 10 or 12 people on the steering group, then Parish Councillors to the minimum, and when a chairperson is selected, it should be someone who does not have a close connection with any of the proposed sites, to reduce conflict. Until then Cllr Wilshire will chair.

Cllr Simpson has resigned, the Council accepted her resignation and thanks her for her work.

- **5. Public participation on matters set out below for up to fifteen minutes, three minutes per person.** [Note: this item is for questions or representations on any matter set out below and is the only opportunity for such at this meeting. New business cannot be raised but should be requested for a future agenda to a councillor or Clerk to the Council outside this meeting]. No issues were raised by the public.
- **6. Wiltshire Councillor's report -** Bin lorries damaging the verge in Sandleaze partly because of the parked cars on the bend. Suggestion is to deter parking by putting an H bar with a white line to remind people that it is not a good place to park. CATg to determine. The men could check that they do not injure the verge. Register with WC to the CATg if ahead with this suggestion. RW to meet with Malcolm Beaven regarding the problem.

Balfour Beatty contract started on the 1st of April, and there will be a reinstatement of the Parish Steward Scheme, who will be regularly around doing the type of jobs that an individual may do rather than a gang. Contact the clerk. Regarding the Mill Race footpath Cllr Midgely has identified that the land 6ft beyond the stream belongs to the Mill. Cllr Wilshire suggested arranging a meeting between Cllr Midgely, Miss Fry and Wiltshire Council. Clerk to contact Paul Millard regarding a meeting.

Cllr Gamble informed the Council that the B3098 it is closing between West Lavington and Westbury at night for around 20 nights which may lead to an increase in traffic through Worton at night.

Cllr Gamble apologised for the lack of progress with SIDs and confirmed that he would work on arranging the scheme.

- **7. Village condition survey feedback -** Cllrs Johnson and Wilshire surveyed the High Street and identified 10 overgrowing hedges, foliage and gravel issues. The hedge outside Prince Hill is a highways issue as it is not accessible from the pavement. Clerk to contact Malc Beaven and to print 15 letters to residents about overhanging vegetation, Cllr Johnson to deliver.
- **8.** Insurance for Mill Race footpath The Council unanimously decided to include the Mill Race footpath 250m from the Sluice to where the footpath widens to six feet along the rest of the Mill Race on their Public Liability Insurance with no additional cost until further notice. This is as a special agreement.
- **9. Neighbourhood Planning report and next steps -** Neighbourhood Planning Area Designation application has not gone out for consultation yet and is in process with the clerk. Clerk to chase.
- **10. Report from the meeting with Marston -** Three people attended to discuss how Worton and Marston can work together more, a village fete event or football match between the villages which is partly funded by Solar panel money from each village was suggested.
- **11.** Update on Whatleys nursery application The proposers have hired an architect and are approaching Wiltshire Council for pre planning advice.
- **12. Set a date for AGM/APM -** Invite speedwatch, Village hall, Link, WI, toddler group,
- 13. Planning matters to receive those decisions notified and to consider application: and any applications received after agenda publication.








all the delicacies were devoured by the group. My favourite was the cider apple cake - very yummy!.



HOPE NATURE CENTRE

The **Hope Nature Centre** is situated in the Southwick Country Park in Trowbridge. We provide work placements for 40 adults with learning disabilities who work in our tearoom and nature park.

In May 2016 The **Hope Nature** Centre will reach its 10th anniversary. Started in 2006 by two local parents of adults with learning disabilities, the charity now occupies a 15 acre plot with a variety of animals including emus, alpacas, donkeys, chickens and rabbits and a tearoom that provides freshly cooked meals and refreshments as well as catering for birthday parties, wakes and business breakfasts. Last year we were awarded a Certificate of Excellence by Trip Advisor and in 2011 were awarded a Queens Award for voluntary service.

Aside from the animals we have a range of play equipment for children including trampolines, slides and swings and have recently installed a specialist inclusive playground area with a wheelchair accessible roundabout, one of only 5 in the county. We also have a fantastic storyteller's chair and stalls that were kindly donated by a local family and run story sessions during the summer months. The addition of a Fairy Wood in March all makes the nominal entrance fee of £2.50/adult, £1.50/child or £7 for a family of 4 great value for money. As a charity that is not government funded all money raised is used to sustain the maintenance and upkeep of the facilities.

To celebrate our 10^{th} Birthday we will be running a week long celebratory event starting on Sunday May 22^{nd} with our Annual Fete.

Monday 23rd May: We will be having a Big Birthday Giveaway where all visitors to the animal park have an opportunity to win free admission, free refreshments and cakes as well as Hope Nature Centre goodie bags.

Tuesday 24th May: We are holding an Open Day for our wonderful donors over the last 10 years to take a look at the facilities that their donations have helped supply. In addition this is an opportunity for parents and carers of adults and teenagers with special needs and anyone working with Special Needs to take a look behind the scenes. Adults with Learning Disabilities are really committed and hard working. We'd love to help some of them find mainstream jobs. If you are a local employer then we'd love you to come along too. Please get in touch. Booking Essential as a complimentary buffet lunch will be supplied.

Wednesday 25th May: Our Birthday Present to the young adults on work placements with us: A Kaya Drumming Session

<u>Thursday 26th May</u>: A private party for all those who have helped the charity become what it is today.

What's happening on the farm!

Whilst thinking what to write this month I was going to start with: "Spring is finally here". However the rain is still coming down and the cattle are still in. But hopefully by the time you read this the weather may have improved enough to let some of the cattle out to grass for the grazing season.

For those of you who are keen bird spotters, the barn owl has been out and about recently. It is such a fantastic sight to see and hopefully we will see it for many years to come. Whilst we are on a bird theme, father informs me that the cuckoos that migrate to this country from Africa for the summer months are on their way back. You can follow their progress on the BTO website.

The preparation for the year's maize crop is progressing however because of the wet weather it has made it difficult to get out on the ground. But the dung is now spread and the soil preparation can begin. The variety we have chosen to grow this year is called Ambition a high yielding yet early variety. An early maturing variety means that we can harvest the crop much earlier than other varieties allowing us to, (hopefully) miss any bad autumn weather and get the crop in without making a mess of the fields.

The artificial fertiliser was applied to all the grassland at the end of March, two weeks later than last year. This is a good indication that spring is much later this year than last. The timing is crucial when applying the prills of nitrogen; too wet it all gets washed away, too cold it burns up in the atmosphere. The ideal conditions are a dry day, where there is some moisture in the soil to allow the prills to be absorbed the soil and plant, with some rain a few days after. Even though it was two weeks late being applied I think I achieved those conditions.

With the grazing season ahead I would like to remind everyone, please keep to the footpaths and dogs on leads whilst walking through our fields. We do not want any accidents to happen whilst the cattle are out grazing this summer.
