

What does success look like to you?

I was inspired by England winning the ashes this year. One more match in the series to go and, despite being the underdogs, the English cricket team have already pulled off an amazing triumph.

The Tour De France, and another fantastic English victory, as Chris Froome becomes the first Englishman to win the event twice.

'Successful' people in other spheres seem to be in a bizarre competition of their own recently. Anna Wintour, the Editor of American Vogue is now on the tennis court at 5.45 each morning; whilst the Apple chief Tim Cook, rises at 3.45 a.m. The message? The most successful don't waste a minute.

Another trait of 'successful' people is never admitting they might be wrong. Vladimir Putin was recently asked in an interview if he'd ever made a mistake. His reply was: 'I'll be totally frank with you. I cannot recollect anything of the kind. It appears that the Lord built my life in such a way that I have nothing to regret'. Really! I wonder what the Lord thinks to that.

Well, I have lumped all these 'successful' people together and that is unfair.

Hard work, dedication and talent are to be admired. But sometimes that can spill over into obsession and even arrogance. That is not so attractive. Some people who are 'successful' in the eyes of the world may not be so accomplished in the things that really matter.

Real success is often found away from the headlines. We are not all given the same gifts, abilities or opportunities. Success for a person with limited ability may be to complete the smallest task. Success for an individual in depression or despair could simply be to get through the day, taking more courage and effort than any of us can imagine.

Success, surely, is about making the best of what we have been given. None of us is without a gift or talent of some sort. It may not be the kind of ability that will make us famous, but that is irrelevant.

I am always impressed in the Bible by those who do not make the headlines.

Barnabas is such a man; he is mentioned only a handful of times, yet without his wisdom St. Paul would never have been accepted by the church and we would not have much of the New Testament. Andrew is another; he appears infrequently, but he introduces his brother Peter to Jesus, and Peter becomes the leader of the church. Barnabas and Andrew, neither a headliner, but both successful in doing what God wanted of them, and that is what counts.

Don't worry about the extent of your gifts and don't compare yourself with others – just use what you have to the full. That is all God asks of any of us, and if you do that, your life will be a true success, headlines or not.



A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

"Power to the People" said Citizen Smith, as portrayed by Robert Lindsey in the 70's sitcom. Do you remember laughing at the idea that his Marxist philosophy could be desirable and popular? In those days it was a serious matter. Communist tyranny still threatened the free world.

Now, of course, we are free from the threat of such a silly idea that the government should control everything and that private enterprise (aka Capitalism) is bad. Democracy ensures liberty and the real will of the people prevails. Doesn't it?

Let's look at the state of democracy here and now. Who can deal with the matters that concern you as you look out of your front window? Where does "power" now lie?

In this area, the foundation tier of administration is the Parish Council, which is concerned with footpaths, playgrounds and, most recently, Neighbourhood Plans. All parish councillors are volunteers and are unpaid. Locally, none have been the subject of elections in recent times, but that does not mean the system is undemocratic. If you wish, you too can put your name forward for any vacancy and, if more than enough do so for the available places, there will be an election.

At the next level, Wiltshire Council is responsible for planning and development control, waste collection and disposal, recycling, trading standards, local highways and buses, council housing, public health and protection, social care for adults and children, safeguarding, local economic development and many other things including open spaces, markets and fairs. If you are not happy with any of this, then please tell me. Or why not put your name forward for election as a councillor in 2017?

Arguably, Wiltshire Council is also responsible for education but central government controls most of the policy and all of the money. Central government also directs much of the policy and the money for other services provided by the lower tiers, but it is exclusively responsible for defence, foreign policy, the NHS, energy, national highways and the railways. Most of all, it is responsible for economic policy and taxation. The next parliamentary election is in 2020.

Above the UK parliament is the European Union, which has several institutions including the EU Parliament, the European Council, the Commission, the Central Bank (which only applies to Euro countries), the Court of Justice and the Court of Auditors. Although these bodies have involvement in several areas, they are most active in fisheries, agriculture, customs, border control and competition rules. The next election to the European Parliament is in 2019 but there will be a referendum about our membership before the end of 2017.

I think I can safely say that none of these institutions are absolute tyrannies, but none are perfect. If you want change, contact your representatives, vote when you can and stand for election if you think you could do better.

WORTON PARISH COUNCIL

<u>Postponement and cancellation of meetings in the Village Hall</u> - Due to the start of major repair work on Worton Village Hall, all Parish Council events planned to be held there have regrettably had to be cancelled or postponed for September, October (and possibly November).

<u>Monthly Council meetings</u> - During September, October and November the normal monthly Parish Council meetings will revert to being held in Five Lanes School.

Open evenings / events - Due to the anticipated popularity of the two planned open evenings / events, they cannot now be held in the Village Hall as planned. Nor is the main meeting room in Five Lanes School large enough to stage such functions. The Council will seek an alternative venue for these events or plan for a revised / combined event hopefully in the refurbished Village Hall in November.

Note: The Wiltshire Housing Allocation Plan 2015 (including confirmation of settlement boundaries) that was due for public consultation in July-August is still in preparation. Wiltshire Council (as at 11 Aug 15) has yet to announce its publication date and the dates of its postponed consultation. 
Solar Farm - The installation is now generating power and the residual works to improve Long Street are being addressed.
