

Post Office Directory Extract 1855

Worton & Marston



Worton and Marston are tithings forming a small isolated village, situated 4 miles south west of Devizes in the parish and Hundred of Potterne and Cannings, Salisbury bishopric and the division and Union of Devizes. For civil matters they are separate and Independent but were ecclesiastically united into one parish in 1852. According to the last census *[1851]*, the population is estimated at 523 and there were 1,744 acres of land. In 1841 a chapel of ease, called Christ Church was erected here at a cost of £1,100. It is a plain cruciform structure capable of containing a congregation of 260 persons; 160 sittings are free; the Rev. A. B. Aldridge, BA. being perpetual curate of the same. Here is a national school and a Wesleyan and Primitive Methodist Chapel. The Bishop of Salisbury is lord of the manor.
