New License

SWINDON POLICE COURT

Thursday

(Before D. Archer, Esq., chairman; H. Calley, Esq.; W. W. Codrington, Esq., and J. E. Prower, Esq.)

Mrs J. Hinder, of the Swan beerhouse, Wroughton, applied to have the license of that house made over to herself, on account of the death of her husband. The applicant only produced the will of her husband, not the probate of the will, and the chairman said under the circumstances they could not grant the application. They had no doubt, however, it was all right, and to save inconvenience, granted a hold over of the license for a month and adjourned the sessions for that time to enable applicant to get the will proved.
