



Wedding of Lilian Joan Greenman to Ronald Victor Fuller

A large number of friends and well wishers assembled at the Parish Church on Saturday afternoon for the wedding of Miss Lilian Joan Greenman, eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. J. Greenman, of 2 Council Houses, to Aircraftman Ronald Victor Fuller, youngest son of Mrs. Fuller of 92 Perry's Lane, Wroughton and the late Mr. F. Fuller. The ceremony was conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. H. V. White) and at the organist was Mr. Tucker, of Swindon (a friend of the bride). The hymns "Love divine, all loves excelling", and "Lead us, Heavenly Father, lead us," were sung and the choir attended to honour the bride, who served with them for a number of years. The bride who was given away by her father, was attired in a white satin gown with train and head dress of orange blossom with veil and carried a shower bouquet of pink carnations. She was attended by her sister (Miss Alma Greenman), who wore a blue taffeta dress, with a net covering to match and a necklace, the gift of the bridegroom. She carried a posy of carnations. Two smaller attendants, who acted as train bearers, were Ann Godden, dressed similarly to the bridesmaid and John Heavens, who wore a royal blue velvet suit, with a Royal Artillery brooch, given by the bridegroom. Mr. Walter Fuller, R. A. (the bridegroom's brother), was best man. As the couple left the church, they were presented with horseshoes by Miss Hazel Bourton and Master Nigel Heavens. The reception, held in the Parish Hall, was attended by over 70 guests. The bride's gift to the bridegroom was a silver cigarette case and the bridegroom gave the bride a silver RAF brooch. Included amongst 60 other presents was a set of cutlery from the staff of Messrs. Titcheners, of Regent Street, Swindon, by whom the bride is employed and a eiderdown and bedspread from Mrs. Titchener.
