YATESBURY



YATESBURY is a parish in the Northern division of the county, Calne Hundred, union and county court division, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts, and rural deanery of Avebury, 5 miles east-by-north from Calne. The church of All Saints is a handsome structure partly Perpendicular and partly Norman, with square embattled tower, surmounted by pinnacles, and containing 5 fine-toned bells; it was restored in 1855, and the chancel, in which are some fine specimens of stained glass, rebuilt: here is also a very ancient Norman font, in good repair. The register dates from 1607. The living is a rectory, of the annual value of £510, with residence, in the gift of, and held by the Rev. Charles Smith, M.A., of Christ Church, Oxford. Here is a Church school, built by the Rector in 1856. The manor is vested in Mrs. Tanner and Charles Albert Tanner, Esq. The principal landowners are Mrs. Tanner, Charles Albert Tanner Esq., and the Rector. The soil is chalk and clay. The chief crops are wheat, oats, barley and turnips. The area is 1,667 acres, and the population in 1861 was 231.
