Reredos Gíft of Miss Chafyn-Groves

The Parish Church. - Some little time since we recorded the gift by Miss Chafyn Grove of a beautiful stained glass window, and it is now our pleasing duty to refer to another of the already long list of gifts which Miss Grove has from time to time given to this church, and to the parish in which she resides. Mr. D. Bell, of London, has just erected at Miss Grove's expense, a magnificent reredos, in the centre of which are three figures, the middle figure representing our Saviour, on the right a figure of St. Martin (to whom the church is dedicated), and on the left St. Michael. The sides are beautifully executed, and on the right near the top are the letters I.H.C., underneath which is a Greek A; and on the left, the letters X.P.C., with the Greek letter O beneath. The whole work reflects great credit on Mr. Bell, and is a valuable edition to the sacred edifice. We may here mention that during Christmas the church has been very prettily decorated by Miss Kate Charlton the much respected and accomplished organist.
